Welcome to Owasso Fishing

Our team gives student anglers a place to learn, compete, build strong partnerships, and represent the team with pride. Whether a student is new to bass fishing or already has tournament experience, the goal is to help every angler grow in skill, confidence, sportsmanship, and knowledge of competitive fishing.

About the team

Owasso HS Fishing Team was created four years ago by Reggie and Andy Anderson out of their family's love for fishing, the outdoors, and spending time together on the water. They wanted to bring that same passion to the Owasso community by creating a place where young anglers could connect with others who share their interest in fishing. Over the past four years the team has continued to provide young anglers with opportunities to develop their skills, build friendships, enjoy the outdoors, and experience the excitement and sportsmanship of tournament fishing.

Club structure

- Owasso Fishing is a nonprofit program operated entirely by volunteers.
- Tournament teams consist of two student anglers. It is encouraged that at least one angler on each team be enrolled in Owasso Public Schools.
- Junior anglers compete in 8th grade and below; high school anglers compete in grades 9–12.

Team registration & membership costs

- Team registration: \$100 per angler, used for the official Owasso Fishing jersey and team hat (\$50 renewal).
- OKHSF membership: \$75 per angler.
- SAF membership: \$25 per angler.
- The team currently covers entry fees for the listed OKHSF Northern Trail events.

Boat captains & equipment

- Volunteer boat captains are essential to tournament participation, and additional captains are always needed.
- Boat captains must be at least 19 years old.
- Tournament boats must be at least 16 feet long and meet event safety requirements.
- Required safety equipment includes properly fitted life jackets, operational kill switches, and all other equipment required by the tournament organization and applicable boating rules.

Practices & tournament preparation

- Primary team practices are planned at Martin Tackle Outdoors. Additional practice opportunities may be offered at Stone Canyon Pond when there is enough team interest.
- The team will meet before each tournament to review lake-specific hazards, boating safety, tournament procedures, and fishing strategy.

- Thank you to TJ Martin and Martin Tackle Outdoors for supporting the team and providing Owasso High School Fishing anglers a 10% shop discount.

2026–2027 OKHSF tournament schedule

Northern Trail — entry fees covered by the club

- November 1, 2026 — Lake Hudson: Lions Club Ramp. Small boat/kayak launch: Chimney Rock Pump Back.
- April 4, 2027 — Grand Lake: Wolf Creek. Small boats/kayaks use the designated event location.
- April 25, 2027 — Lake Tenkiller: Fisherman's Point. Small boats/kayaks use the designated event location.

Southern Trail — club coverage to be determined

- October 25, 2026 — McGee Creek: Buster Hight Ramp.
- April 18, 2027 — Lake Eufaula: Nichols Point. Small boat/kayak launch: Onapa.
- May 16, 2027 — Lake Texoma: Catfish Bay.

Postseason & major events

- May 1–2, 2027: SAF State Championship — Fort Gibson Lake, Taylor Ferry North.
- May 22–23, 2027: OKHSF Championship — Lake Eufaula, Nichols Point.
- June 22–26, 2027: TBF Nationals / World Finals — Lake Hartwell.
- July 2027: TBF Junior World Finals.

The coaching staff will also review B.A.S.S. youth tournament opportunities. Anglers interested in additional competition may participate in eligible events outside the primary team schedule. OKHSF now has a Kayak Division that fishes the same lakes on the same dates; registration, fees, rules, and standings are at okhsfishing.com.

Sponsors & team uniform

- Sponsors help make team opportunities possible. Anglers and families are encouraged to support the businesses and organizations that support Owasso Fishing.
- Martin Tackle Outdoors provides Owasso High School Fishing anglers a 10% discount.
- Nichols Marine provides team members a 10% discount.
- Official team jerseys and hats are included with team registration and are expected to be worn at tournaments so anglers consistently represent Owasso Fishing and its sponsors.

Sportsmanship & conduct

- Every angler represents Owasso Fishing at practices, tournaments, weigh-ins, meetings, and team events.
- Students are expected to treat teammates, coaches, boat captains, tournament officials, competitors, sponsors, volunteers, and host facilities with respect.
- Safe decisions, good sportsmanship, responsible fish care, conservation, and appropriate behavior are expected at all times.
